Improving User Management of the Community Health Record (CHR)



As part of our ongoing efforts to improve our services, we implemented new CHR enhancements focused on making user management easier, improving system performance, and strengthening security.

To improve the user management, CHR admins will now see displays with additional details, including account status (active, deactivated or locked), organization and the last login. We also improved the "Disable User" workflow with the ability to toggle views from "active users" to "deactivated users" and "all users."

These changes allow for CHR admins to view details on who has access to their CHR.

Also, to ensure continued alignment with current HITRUST standards and best practices, more enhanced security updates were implemented in the CHR. And other general improvements were made to improve the overall performance and create a smoother, more reliable user experience.
